The website for the NEA also has information that might be helpful as you begin your career in education. Not only does it describe the ongoing activities of the Union at the national level, but it also provides information on member benefits, professional development, and helpful tips for managing your work life. The best way to ascertain if any of the information is of interest, is to visit the site and see what is available.

There are a few places that might provide useful information. The Gateway to Educational Materials Catalog (GEM) has information that describes over 40,000 educational resources found on various Internet sites. You might also find the Teacher toolkit useful as well as Works4Me. Finally, the NEA created an online community for NEA members (OWL.org) which is organized into channels such as "My Profession" which provides information and tools to help teachers in their classrooms. Whether some, or any, of these resources will be beneficial to the issues you face, is unknown. However, knowing that resources are available might just make things a bit easier as you begin your teaching career.
